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Show your home: Luxury Nashville home offers space for wine lovers in Burton Valley area

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Located in the Seven Hills subdivision of the Burton Valley area, the four story, 8,436square-foot home at 4613 General Lowrey Drive has five bedrooms, seven full and one half bathrooms and plenty of space for recreation, exercising and even wine-tasting.

Purchased by the current owners as a new construction in 2016, it has the elegance of a turn of the century farmhouse but with all the bells and whistles of a luxury estate.

"The luxurious upgrades the owners have added with love and care set it apart from the standard in new construction," says Patricia Rappa Robbe, the home's listing agent. "The attention to state of the art comfort and practicality go beyond what you see in most homes."

The home is currently listed for \$3.975 million.

Complete with mature trees, the 1-plus-acre property is surrounded by white crossbuck fencing reminiscent of an equestrian estate, yet it is just minutes from shopping, restaurants and hospitals. The home's spacious front porch, buttery white paint and dramatic dormer windows that flank the second story and define the third story of the home create an inviting vignette.

A flagstone pathway leading to a flared staircase invites visitors to Craftsman-style double doors with a transom window that's duplicated on the other front windows of the home.

In the entryway, wood floors shine, leading upstairs or through to the rest of the house. To the immediate left, the formal dining room offers plenty of natural light and leads into the kitchen, while straight through the foyer down the hall, there's a second entrance the kitchen, making a horseshoe.

The all-white kitchen is ideal for the gourmand. It features an enormous double fridge/freezer, a gas range with two separate ovens and an island with bar seating, built-in beverage refrigerator and wine storage. There's ample space inside white floor to ceiling cabinets with a wainscotting finish and stainless hardware that compliment the stainless appliances and the gray threads snaking through the Carerra marble countertops. There's also a huge walk-in pantry and a breakfast nook with a huge picture window overlooking the back deck and the yard beyond.

Off the kitchen, there's a spacious living room, anchored by a cozy gas fireplace whose mantel adds a traditional element to the space with fluted legs and tiered molding, while the dark paint on the wall behind adds drama.

Two recessed areas have built-in cabinets with wainscotting, while recessed can lighting makes it the ideal place for movie night. All along one wall, glass accordion doors open into the sunroom. Surrounded by windows and with access to the patio, it also features a gas fireplace and a second informal dining space. The enclosed sunroom is ideal for winter months and acts almost as a private sitting room to the main floor primary suite.

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The primary suite is light-filled, with picture windows overlooking the back patio, crown molding, neutral walls, plantation shutters and wood floors. The primary suite has an oversized ensuite bathroom with traditional white cabinetry, marble floors, counter tops, and shower tiles, and a dual sink vanity with sconce lighting. Through the bath, a spacious dressing room has built-in dressers and shelving.

The home has two offices, one on the ground floor and one on the second floor, that could easily be used as bedrooms. It also has six additional full bathrooms each outfitted in whites, grays and neutrals, some with vanity cabinets or pedestal sinks, with shower stalls or a bathtub. Each bedroom has its own ensuite, plus there are two additional full bathrooms. There's also an additional half bath.

Upstairs, there is a full living room space that anchors the surrounding four bedrooms with French doors leading to a sunroom that's among the eaves of the roof. Though it's light-filled with a view of the treetops, its best feature is the seating that's suspended from the ceiling by ropes. There are four additional bedrooms tucked into the dormer windows, each well-lit and spacious. There's an additional rec room and craft space that adds livability to the upstairs area.

Downstairs on the basement level, there's a fully finished living space that could be used for entertainment or as a mother-in-law suite. It has a home theater with a retractable screen and plenty of space for games or lounge furniture. Right now it's part of the wine tasting and storage room. The space also has an additional full kitchen, outfitted with blue cabinets, a stovetop, microwave, range, dishwasher and fridge. It's ideal for entertaining or for multigenerational living. The home even has elevator capabilities, but it just needs installation.

The basement is also outfitted with a wine cave. Not only does the cave has plenty of racks for storing wine, but it even has a tasting sink. The basement has an exercise room that could be converted into a bedroom, along with a full bathroom. The property has a large storage space plus a four-car garage, a carport and driveway parking.

Outside, the home's main level has a spacious back deck that overlooks the lawn and a split staircase leading to the lawn. On the ground level, a flagstone path leads to a circular stone patio that would be ideal for a fireside gathering, plus there's a water feature for added serenity. The yard has plenty of space for a pool, if desired. The property is surrounded by a line of mature trees that add seclusion and privacy.
